Course Description (Catalog)

This practicum provides nurse educator students the opportunity to apply specialized learning essential to strengthen and advance their own nursing practice in a particular area or focus in a direct care role. Students work with the practicum coordinator and faculty to identify a qualified preceptor and to select the practicum site for a wide variety of clinical practice settings consistent with AACN's Master's Essentials (2011). 160 hours of clinical practice are required for completion of this practicum. All core and specialty courses must be completed before taking this course.

Course Scope

During this 16-week, 160 hours of supervised clinical practicum course, students will complete clinical practice experiences designed to advance and strengthen patient care delivery skills. Students will work with a qualified preceptor in a direct-care role in a sustained clinical practice setting. These direct-care experiences enable students to integrate new knowledge and demonstrate attainment of program outcomes where the experiences are evaluated by nursing faculty. Direct care experiences will be required for a minimum of 60 of the practicum hours. Students may work with nurses in an in-direct role (such as an academic setting) for the remaining 100 hours.

Course Learning Objectives

The following objectives are aligned with the MSN Program Outcomes (PO):

1. Synthesize and apply advanced practice nursing concepts and skills to the role of the nurse educator.
2. Apply specialized learning with a focus on a population of interest or specific role to strengthen and advance nursing care.
3. Develop clinical proficiency through focused clinical practice experiences to advance patient care, intervention skills, and system assessment that enhance understanding of organizational dynamics.
4. Select appropriate personal learning objectives for a clinical practicum experience.
5. Demonstrate effective communication skills in working with members of an interprofessional healthcare team.

6. Summarize your learning in the clinical practicum through effective writing and presentation skills

Module Learning Objectives are located within the course.

Course Delivery Method

This course delivered via distance learning will enable students to complete academic work in a flexible manner, completely online. The 160 hours of the nurse educator practicum will take place in person in a clinical setting. The scheduling of these hours will vary to accommodate student and preceptor schedules and meet the course objectives. Course materials and access to an online learning management system will be made available to each student. Online assignments are due weekly as noted on the course outline and can include Forum questions and written assignments. Assigned MSN faculty will support the students throughout this sixteen-week course and is responsible for the final practicum assessment and evaluation of student attainment of objectives.

The School of Health Sciences requires use of APA format and style and all students are encouraged to have a current copy of the *APA Publication Manual*. All written assignments are to be submitted in APA format style unless otherwise noted in the assignment directions.

Evaluation Procedures

Discussions

Please join the discussions each week. Replies must be posted in the week due and replies after the end of the each week will not be graded. The Discussions are for student interaction and input should be submitted before the week ends in order to fully participate in the discussions. Students should demonstrate their own knowledge in the discussions and avoid copying and pasting from websites. In this class there are 7 graded discussions.

Guidelines:

- Post the initial response to each discussions by 11:55pm, ET, Wednesday
- Initial responses are to be original in content and demonstrate a thorough analysis of the topic.
- Reply to ***more than 2*** of your classmates in each forum by 11:55pm, ET, Sunday.
- Responses to classmates are significant to advance the discussions.
- All discussions can be accessed in the Discussions section of the course.
- Respond to all questions posed to you in your initial post by instructor and/or peers.

An initial post must precede the response posts to peers. An initial post received after Wednesday 11:55 pm will receive a 10% deduction for each day, for 3 days, prior to discussions being graded. This means the highest grade possible for a late submission of 3 days, is 70%. However, response posts are due by Sunday 11:55 pm. If response posts are not submitted by this time, the discussion is over. Therefore, no points can be awarded for collaboration, and the highest grade possible for late submission past 3 days is 60%.

Nursing Program Policies

Assignment and Coursework Grading Policy

Students are expected to submit classroom assignments by the designated due date and to complete the course according to the published class schedule. Failure to submit coursework by the designated due date will result in a ten percent (10%) penalty per day until three (3) days after the coursework is due. Therefore, after three (3) days, the maximum grade the student can achieve with a late submission will be a grade of 70% (C-). If a student is ill, has a family crisis, or will miss scheduled coursework deadlines for any reason, the student shall notify the instructor in advance if at all possible. Assignments will NOT be accepted more than seven (7) days after the due date unless prior arrangements have been made in advance of the due date.

Use of Online Sources such as Course Hero

This policy aligns with the comprehensive exam, which also requires a B- (80%) or better to pass. Master's students must have at least a 3.0 GPA in order to graduate.
